	fun this is printmaking for anyone who likes to work freely with colour and line.	
	Learn the basics of this simple hand-printing process and produce a set of single and multi-colour prints in this structured but relaxed workshop. We will	
	look at creating interesting layers using additive & subtractive mark-making	
	techniques, together with drawn monoprints, collage, masks and more!
