About the course/workshop	Explore the subtle, almost monochrome palettes of the winter landscape in this seasonal workshop. Experiment with different types of charcoal, inks, pastels, and a variety of tools to explore creative mark-making, working on different grounds, using resists, bleach, spritzing & spattering.  These dry and wet monochrome media are wonderful versatile mediums both individually and in combination with each other. A multitude of effects can be created from fine delicate linework to rich velvety tones and dramatic contrasts the range can be interesting and sometimes unexpected!  No experience needed in this fun and informal workshopjust a big apron and a willingness to get messy!	
What to bring	Willow charcoal and/or compressed charcoal (tutor will also bring some) Black Acrylic or India Ink (waterproof) Heavy cartridge paper or watercolour paper (not too rough) Optional: Tinted papers such as sugar paper or pastel paper Quink or Brusho / Koh-I-Noor (watersoluble dye-base inks that are bleachable), if you have them – don't buy specially - the tutor will bring some to borrow Soft paintbrushes or Brush Pen (the sort with a reservoir that you can fill with ink or water) Optional colour media: Watercolours/ gouache or acrylic paint (whatever you have – Wintery colours – blues, browns, ochres etc Optional: chalk pastels (blues, browns, greys)  Apron, Baby wipes, Kitchen roll
